Thank you for referring the PCP motion to Cochrane's Environmental Task Force. I initially misunderstood the referral, and I appreciate that it's a sincere effort to gather input. Thank you for taking this seriously and making time to review the issue thoroughly.

My concerns remain centered on transparency and informed consent—especially when municipalities are participating in long-term climate programs aligned with international frameworks.

For clarification: municipalities can still receive Green Municipal Fund (GMF) grants without being in the PCP program. This is confirmed by FCM and has been the case for other communities that chose to step back.

I'd also be glad to present to the Environmental Task Force if that would help inform their review. My goal is to support a constructive conversation rooted in facts and local priorities.
